The Cheyenne County Fair and Rodeo Queen and Princess contest will be held on Tuesday, August 2, 2016. One queen and one princess will be chosen by an impartial judge. The winners will represent Cheyenne County at various fairs, rodeos and other functions.

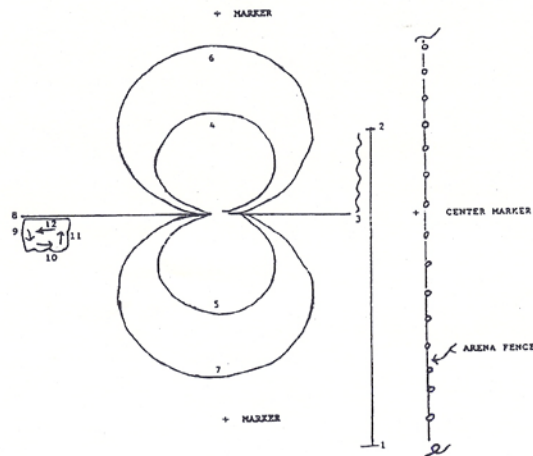
## Contest Rules

- Appearance – the aim of this division is to select the girl who rates the highest in grooming, posture, poise, fashion sense and the girl who most reflects the western image. Judges will be looking for neatness and cleanliness in every detail such as complexion, hands, hair, hats, boots, and other apparel.
- Personality – the aim of this division is to select the girl who rates the highest in education, conversational ability, sense of humor, genuine interest in and consideration for others. Has a happy out look on life.
- Horsemanship – the aim of this division is to select the girl who rates highest in riding ability, control of their mount, mounting and dismounting, balance, position of hands, feet, seat and the way that each situation is handled.
- Questions and interview – the aim of this division is to select the girl who rates the highest in interview ability, getting their ideas across and thoughts across in a conversation and on answering the question “Why I want to be the next Cheyenne County Fair and Rodeo Queen/Princess”.
- A written test
- Contestants are required to take a test, do the selected patterns, interview with the judge. Answer the question “Why I want to be the next Cheyenne County Fair & Rodeo Queen/Princess” and do the Queens wave.
- Required to get at least 70% on both the written and riding tests to be crowned.
- Required to sign contract at crowning time, with a copy of birth certificate.
- Attire for the contest is as follows:
  - a. Western Hat
  - b. Dark Blue Jeans
  - c. Long sleeve white shirt with cuffs and collar. Any color may be used for hats, boots, belts, etc.
- Forms must be filled out and returned to the royalty coordinator by mail or hand delivered no later than 6:00 p.m. August 1, 2016 addressed to Cheyenne County Fair Board, P.O. Box 395, Cheyenne Wells, Co. 80810. Questions call Rusty at 719-244-2730.

## PATTERN

- 1 2 Lope in a straight line at least 20 feet in from fence.
- 2 Stop past center marker – back in straight line to center marker.
- 3 Settle horse for 10 seconds.
- \*4&5 Trot a small figure 8.
- \*6&7 Lope a larger figure 8 at moderate speed.
- 8 Stop & settle horse for 10 seconds.
- 9 Side pass to the left.
- 10 Back.
- 11 Side pass to right.
- 12 Walk forward to point 8 for judge's inspection.

- Note: the proper lead change will be expected.
